

## Outbreak Management Plan

## September 2021

When should my child self -isolate or miss school?







- From 16<sup>th</sup> August 2021, children under 18 (or double vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has COVID.
- Instead, they should book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative



- If your child develops COVID symptoms at home, they should stay at home and should book a PCR test instead of doing a home Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops COVID symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.
- If your child tests positive for COVID, they will need to selfisolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 years and 6 months old or fully vaccinated (plus 2 weeks) but instead should book a PCR test. Please see government guidance for further details on self-isolation requirements.

# Community COVID Risk

Low Community Transmission, No School Cases.

Green Control Measures

- There have been no cases of Covid within the school for 10 school days.
- Cases of COVID locally are low and/or stable
- Hospitalisation/ Deaths due to COVID nationally are low.

No COVID measures are necessary beyond:

- Reminding children of good hand –hygiene
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical
- Ensuring children/staff stay at home if they have COVID symptoms (and to book a PCR test)
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes
- Appropriate use of PPE
- Encourage vaccination for eligible staff
- Staff to engage with NHS Track and Trace if contacted

Staff to continue to test themselves using Lateral flow tests until told otherwise by the DFE.

- No current COVID cases recorded at school, but.....
- Cases of COVID are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.
- Wiltshire Public
   Health/ Public Health
   England issue
   warnings of expected
   local/national
   infection wave.

- Ventilation of classrooms increased & hand washing supervised
- Large indoor public performance audience numbers may be reduced
- Staff-room capacity may be reduced
- Enhanced cleaning focusing on touch points and shared equipment
- Whole -school assemblies are replaced with Key -Stage Collective Worship
- Clinically Vulnerable staff meet with Line managers to review their individual risk assessment & discuss additional protection (eg use of face coverings, reduction in movement between groups of children)
- Staff to engage with NHS Track and Trace if contacted
- Promote vaccination for eligible staff
- Promotion of PCR testing for close contacts

# Number of Cases



A single child tests **POSITIVE** 

## Description

- Between 1 to 4 children testing positive for COVID in a class
- No other classes are affected

### **Actions**

- The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete in line with the Remote Learning Policy
- FSM is provided for eligible pupils
- Safeguarding risk assessment is completed for Vulnerable pupils not in school
- SEND worker and other agencies informed if required
- The parents/carers of the pupil are contacted directly by NHS Test & Trace to establish likely contacts
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Test
   & Trace and advised to book a PCR Test.
- Pupils do not need to miss school or selfisolate whilst they wait for the results of the PCR test unless they have COVID symptoms or their initial PCR test comes back void or inconclusive



5 pupils or staff within a single class test positive within 10 days of each other.

5 cases that can be traced back to a single club There has been 5

### As above for each positive case

#### In addition to the above:

- The school will discuss the outbreak with Wiltshire Public Health and agree strengthening proactive measures for 10 school days, including:
  - Re introducing staff face masks for corridors & communal areas
  - Adapting, limiting or postponing events, trips, open days, visitors and performances
  - Reverting to pre-recorded Collective Worship in classrooms (outdoor whole school could be considered if class separation is maintained)
  - Reducing the number of classes staff work across
  - Revert back to single class interventions
- Consider re-introducing remote learning for affected class for 10 days if cases continue to rise in this class but not across the school



COVID cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10-day period across multiple classes  Despite the measures indicated above, COVID cases within the school continue to rise within a 10day period with multiple groups & staff affected, suggesting that COVID is spreading widely throughout the school.

- Incident Management Team meeting held between the school and Wiltshire Public Health to agree possible further measures, for a further 10 days, including:
  - Re-introducing class bubbles.
  - Reverting to class-based lunches
  - Limiting all non -essential visitors to school
  - Postponing all non-essential events
  - Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 days considered
  - Cancelling school trips
  - Re-introduce any other measure from original COVID risk assessments where required (eg singing, fabric, staggered starts and finish times etc)
